visitor center a reality. These folks have great vision for the future of tourism in our two-county region.

FY 2022 will always be remembered as the year that the MVEDP sold the balance of its land holdings. The last lot in our Regional Business Park was sold as well as the remaining 12 acres at our Philipsburg Commerce Park property, the site of the former Philipsburg Area Hospital. The estimated value of the two future investments at the former hospital site is over \$9.5 million. We are working diligently to find a site that can be developed into a business park that will stimulate future private investment here.

There are some other terrific projects being considered in our area including a new townhome development, new sewer service along Rt. 350 to include Glass City, Linnwood and the Twig Settlement area, and the new seats at the Rowland Theatre! When combined with the proposed new MVEMS ambulance headquarters/training facility, and the Graystone residential development, it truly can be said that our area is currently the home to some very positive developments.

The MVEDP and the Moshannon Valley region were just featured in an online publication called **Happy Valley Industry**. Just Google this name and the January 24th edition should pop up which features our area. This piece provides great evidence of the positive economic development that has occurred here since 1990. Our goal when we contacted the folks at Happy Valley Industry was to get an article in their publication that would be seen by the many entrepreneurs in the Happy Valley region.

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

"Spotlight on Business" - GEO Moshannon Valley Processing Center



The Moshannon Valley Economic Development Partnership is pleased to feature the Moshannon Valley Processing Center (MVPC) in this Spotlight on Business feature.

The 243,000 square foot facility, located about 12 miles northwest of Mid-State Regional Airport, was built in 2006 and proudly serves the U.S. Department of Homeland Security with an unyielding commitment to its employees and the people they support.

The Moshannon Valley Processing Center MVPC) is a contractor operated, secure, processing facility used by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE). MVPC houses low-security male residents who are being detained while they seek legal immigrant status in the U.S.

"Our mission is to provide the highest level of service to our customer; our primary objective is to ensure the safety of the community, staff, and those entrusted to our care," said Leonard Oddo, the Facility Administrator for GEO Secure Services. Oddo credits the dedication and outstanding service of the employees for ensuring the facility consistently meets its mission. "Our well-selected, trained, professional staff exhibits dedication, integrity, responsibility, ethical conduct, and pride in their daily lives."

The economic benefit of the Moshannon Valley Processing Center is notable. In 2022, the MVPC generated an estimated \$33.5 million to the Clearfield County area, including over \$650,000 in local sales and property taxes. In addition, MVPC employs more than 350 men and women, most of whom live in the Clearfield County area.

The support services provided at immigration processing centers like MVPC are delivered in a safe and humane environment. These facilities are highly rated by independent national accreditation organizations, including the American Correctional Association and the National Com-

mission on Health Care.

The MVPC strives daily to foster a healthy facility culture that promotes the social wellbeing of those entrusted to their care. There is 24/7 access to medical, dental, and mental health services. They have access to telephones, in person and video visitation, legal services, faith-based opportunities, healthy snacks, hygiene products, and culturally sensitive menu options available upon request. Recreational amenities include turf soccer fields, exercise equipment, and flat screen TVs in the living areas. Appropriate clothing is also provided for residents for the cold Pennsylvania winters.

The MVPC team is also deeply committed to its community. Each year, they provide local scholar-ships and charitable donations totaling approximately \$20,000. This past November, MVPC conducted a Thanksgiving Day food drive with the Philipsburg Community Action Center that provided full Thanksgiving meals – including a turkey – for 25 families, then partnered with Poppy & Co. Café for a Christmas meal food drive that prepared and delivered meals to area shut-ins. The facility partnered with Cen-Clear Child Services for its annual Giving Tree, which provided toys, hats, gloves and scarves to less fortunate children. MVPC staff also participated in a Holiday Cheer drive, collecting donations for area nursing homes.



The MVEDP and the PRC continue to work toward the revitalization of the downtown Philipsburg area. Pictured is Dustin Minarchick, President of the MVEDP and Eric Rusnak, President of the PRC signing the new Cooperation Agreement for FY 2023.

The MVEDP first got involved in the downtown revitalization effort in 1996, a year after the McCrory's store closed. Through the financial support of the business community from the area, the state's Main Street Program was brought to the downtown with the first-ever full-time manager of the revitalization effort. The already existing Philipsburg Revitalization Corporation organization was resurrected and continues to work on downtown development to this day.

The Borough of Philipsburg has been an extremely important partner in the downtown revitalization effort. Their recent use of eminent domain powers has had a very positive impact on the physical appearance and safety of the downtown area. The MVEDP and the PRC will continue to partner with the borough and the business community to enhance the downtown commercial district.

MVEDP Sets the Interest Rate On Its Loan Program

The MVEDP's Revolving Loan Fund Program has been available to local businesses since 1991. This matching loan funding can be used for working capital, machinery and equipment purchases, and for land acquisitions and building projects.

The new interest rate for the program has been set at 4%. Jeff Herr is the chairman of the MVEDP's revolving loan fund committee. Other loan committee members include: Bill Jones, Rusty Christoff, Dustin Minarchick, Bryan Bennett, Jim Pollock, and Gary Turner

One of the best features of the RLF program is its quick turnaround time. Once a completed application is received by the MVEDP, a meeting of the committee is called and if the loan is approved, the loan proceeds can be available to the borrower in less than 30 days.
