The board voted in favor of Rush Township's work to create a new solar zoning ordinance.

highway plan. Corridor O was to be a fourlane highway connection from Interstate-99 in Centre County to Interstate-80 in Clearfield County. PennDOT, and numerous engineering and environmental consulting firms worked to devise a four-lane highway plan that would connect the two interstates. It was reported that the cost of the five-year Corridor O planning effort was \$25 million. That effort resulted in a proposed route of Corridor O through the two counties. The MVEDP still maintains an entire box of files from the Corridor O planning effort. The Corridor O project will only happen if the citizens of this area and our elected officials decide that it is a project that must be pursued for the safety and health of the citizens who live here.

## MVEDP to Survey Businesses Located Within the Moshannon Valley Regional Business Park



The MVEDP wants to know a key financial benefit of the Regional Business Park: the amount of tax dollars that are returned to government from the businesses located there. Property taxes and wage payroll taxes are the key focus of the survey. Approximately a year ago, the MVEDP did a preliminary investigation into the taxes paid and determined that \$4.18 million per year is paid by the employees and businesses located at the Regional Business Park. The survey of businesses will enable the MVEDP to determine the exact amount paid in taxes each year. Federal income taxes will not be included in the survey.

The MVEDP wants to use the tax payment information in its work to secure new grant funding for the development of another business park. Government investment in the creation of new business parks is a very wise investment of taxpayer dollars. The Regional Business Park was built at a cost of \$2.1 million and there was \$1.7 million of grants involved. Compare that \$1.7 million number to the preliminary taxes generated: \$4.18 million per year. The taxpayers of the state should very much want its government to invest in business park development projects.

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# **Business Tenants Changing Their Space Footprints at the MVEC**



Business tenants that occupy space within the Moshannon Valley Enterprise Center are changing the amount of space that they rent.

The MVEDP recently learned that American Home Patient (now Lincare) will significantly downsize the space that it rents at the Moshannon Valley Enterprise Center. Their downsizing of space can be directly attributed to the COVID 19 epidemic and the need to have employees working from home. Lincare has now determined that it can be just as efficient in the management of its customers by having the employees remain working from home. The downsizing has not impacted their employment numbers.

Lincare has occupied space at the MVEC since September 2001, a period of almost 23 years. Back then, the company was having difficulties with a previous landlord and decided to look for other space to rent. The company will vacate an area of 12,147 square feet and continue renting an area of 5,900 square feet at the Enterprise Center.

Two companies have recently expanded the amount of space that they rent: ShipItDone and PolyK Technologies. They have rented an additional 16,000 square feet of space. They are also adding new employees to their workforces.

The MVEDP is aware of another business tenant of the MVEC that is considering an expansion and the staff awaits the opportunity to assist them with their project. More news about this potential business expansion will be released in the near future.

The MVEDP still has some space for lease at the Enterprise Center so contact our office if we can assist you with your space needs.

# Renovations Continue at the Moshannon Valley Enterprise Center

The Moshannon Valley Enterprise Center was placed in service to the MVEDP in 1988. Every year, there is renovation work completed to address building issues that might impact the business tenants of the MVEC.

The MVEDP continues to pursue major improvements at the Enterprise Center. There is currently a restroom renovation project that was just completed at a cost just over \$57,000.

Two new rooftop HVAC units will also be replaced at a cost of almost \$40,000. Other improvements are being pursued that will cost approximately \$145,000.00.

#### **Real Estate Taxes to be Paid Soon**

The MVEDP is a non-profit organization, but it is liable to pay its fair share of property taxes. The MVEDP is one of the top taxpaying businesses in Rush Township. For Fiscal Year 2024, the MVEDP will pay \$68,043.62 in property/school taxes. Over a ten-year period from 2015 through 2024, the MVEDP paid \$611,527.23 in taxes to support local governments and the Philipsburg-Osceola Area school district.

# Revolving Loan Fund Program Available to Area Businesses

The MVEDP has administered a revolving loan fund program since 1990. The MVEDP likes to partner with the banking professionals on projects that will strengthen local companies. Funds can be used for land and building projects, working capital, and machinery and equipment purchases. The MVEDP offers a below-market interest rate in exchange for job retention and job creation. 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


